Show Racism the Red Card

Two ex-professional footballers visited Eastfield Primary School to talk to children about racism. Leon Braithwaite and Samuel Okikiolu spoke to children in Years 4, 5 and 6 about the causes and consequences of racism and the various forms it can take. They are part of the anti-racism educational charity Show Racism the Red Card, which delivers workshops to more than 50,000 young people each year.

The event was organised by Eastfield's Equalities Team. Deputy Headteacher, Mrs. Hussain, explained: "We want to encourage our pupils to talk about and celebrate our differences and to challenge racism in their communities."
